Karl Fredrickson gave another of his usual outstanding presentations in March. Thanks Karl!!! That's from the reports I have received beings I was in New Mexico on that day.





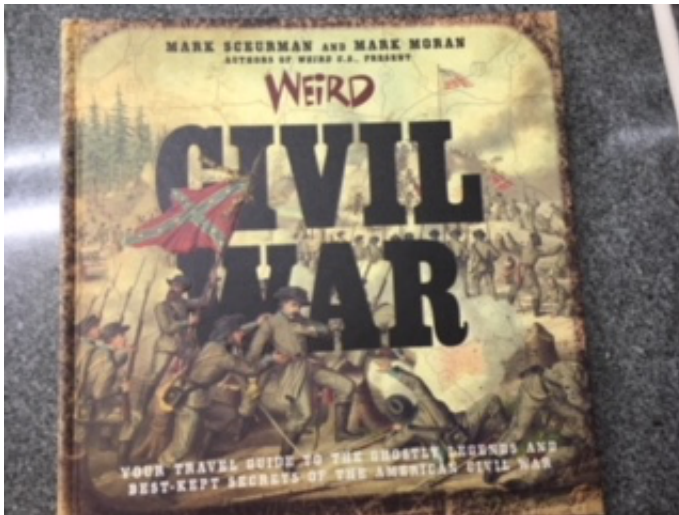

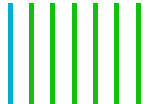

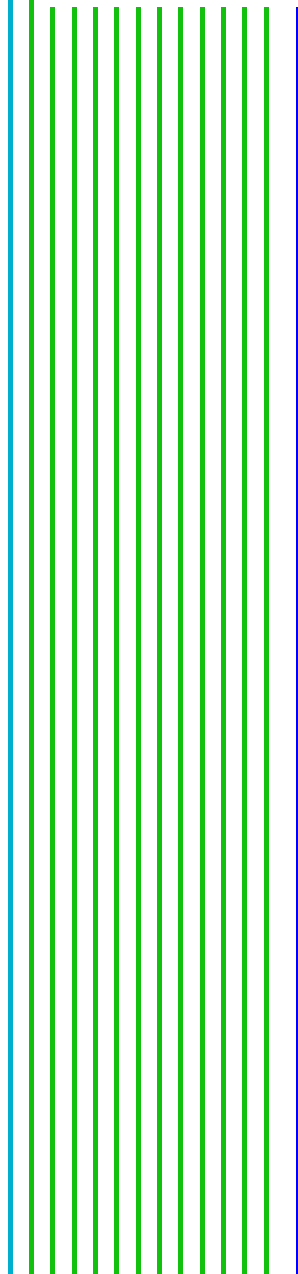

HISTORY OF THE DAY

April 19, 1831

Baltimoreans attack Union troops

Residents of Baltimore, Maryland, attack a Union regiment while the group makes its way to Washington, D.C.

Baltimore's hostilities to the North were already well known, as just two percent of the city's voters cast their ballots for Abraham Lincoln for president while nearly half supported John Breckinridge, the Southern Democratic Party candidate. Lincoln was to pass through Baltimore on his way to Washington for his inauguration, but death threats forced the president-elect to slip through the city in the middle

of the night in disguise.
