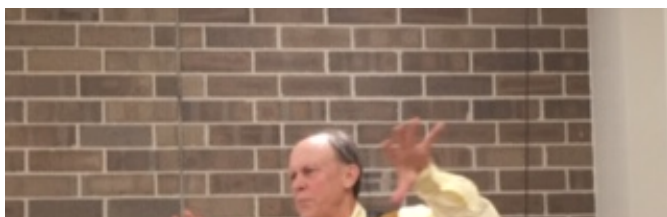

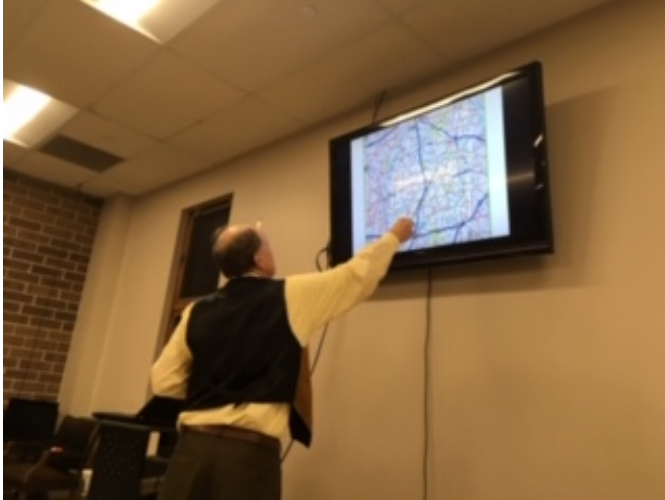

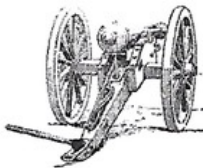

HISTORY TODAY:

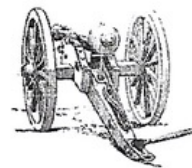
