
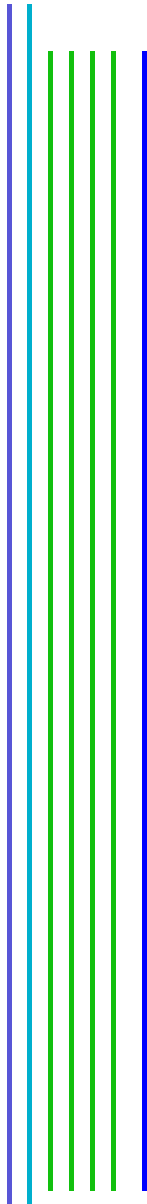

Our Mission? Preservation and interpretation of all American Civil War Battlefields

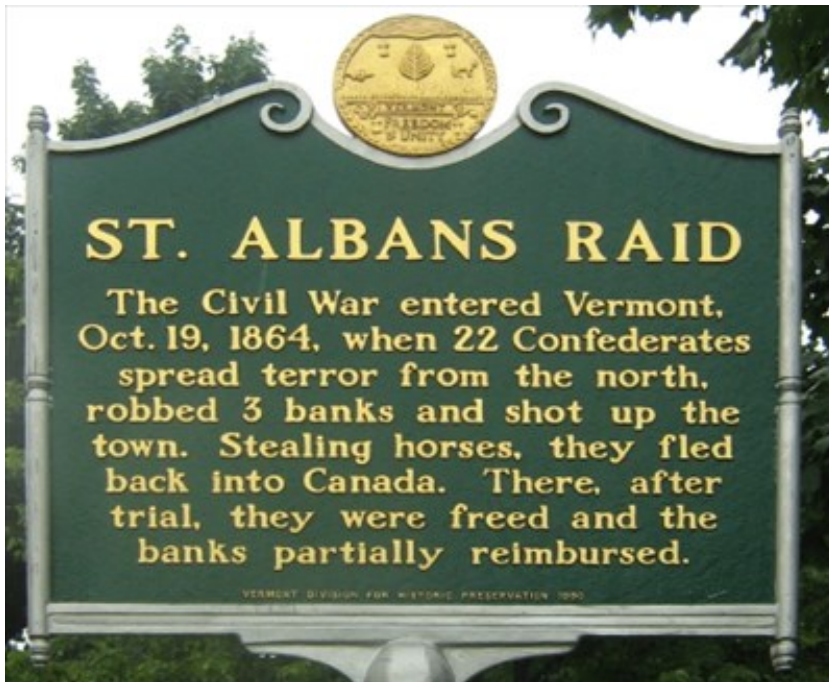

John Tyler dies

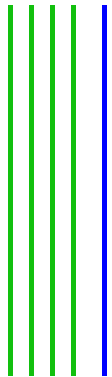
On this day in 1862, former U.S. President and Confederate congressman-elect John Tyler dies at age 71 in Richmond, Virginia.

Tyler, who was born in Virginia in 1790, served as a U.S. congressman and as governor of his home state before winning election to the U.S. Senate. During the 1830s, when many of the [sectional](#) issues were emerging in national politics.
